

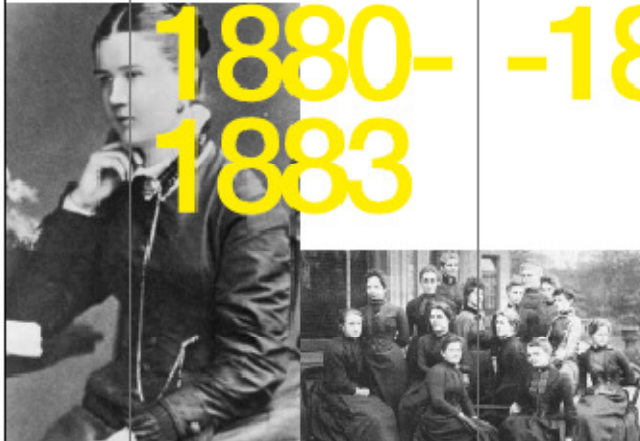

1904 Two chemical laboratories were built, showing that Science was now acceptable for girls to study.

1911 The school changed its name from Liverpool High School to The Belvedere School to avoid confusion with other Liverpool high schools.



HISTORY OF THE BELVEDERE



1879 An application was made, and accepted, to open a high school for girls in south Liverpool.

1880 The school opened in House 17 for the summer term, with 45 pupils.

1883 Examination subjects were at first limited to Arithmetic, French, German, Latin and Geography.

1939 The school was evacuated to Shrewsbury, but returned after three months when none of the expected bombing occurred.

1940 The school continued in Belvidere Road despite the Liverpool blitz. Many pupils had lessons in air raid shelters during raids.

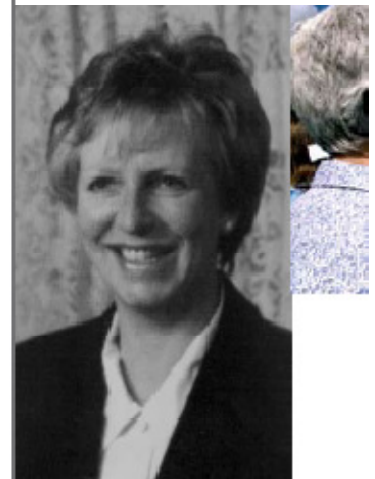

1979 A new School Hall (present day gym) was built and opened.

1986 New science laboratories were opened.

1993 The Reference Library was moved to its present position in the room that was formerly used as the Assembly Hall.

1994 A new Sixth Form Centre, staffroom and art room were built. House 19 was now dedicated to music.

1996 A new Junior School Hall was built.

1999 The launch of the Open Access Scheme.

2001 A technology suite and dining rooms were opened in House 11, which was previously occupied by the Little Sisters of the Assumption Convent. The garden behind House 11 is kept as a place of reflection and relaxation.
